

# Storm Drain Marker Program

Many people do not realize that water in the storm drain flows, untreated, directly into our surrounding water bodies. When contaminants are introduced into the storm drain system, often through illegal dumping, polluted stormwater can result in poor water quality and threaten the health of the creeks, rivers, and marshes we love.



The Town of Mount Pleasant's Storm Drain Marker Program is an important way that citizens can help prevent illegal dumping in our community. The Storm Drain Marker Program relies on resident participation for success.

Volunteers install storm drain decals and distribute informational flyers in neighborhoods. Decals alert citizens that storm drains drain to waterways and dumping is not allowed.

The program is *free* to participants and the Town of Mount Pleasant provides all decal installation materials and flyers for distribution necessary.

Storm drain markers have already been installed in the following neighborhoods: I'On, Hobcaw Creek, Creekside, Cooper Estates, Belle Hall, Wando Lakes, portions of Dune West, and Brickyard Plantation.
