

Special.

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., June 8, 1900.  
 A Special Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8.30.

Present - R. W. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Haulen, Mitchell, Smith and Pinckney.

Purposes

The Intendant stated that this meeting had been called for the purpose of passing the two Bills relating to the discontinued Stations on the Trolley Line to their Third Reading, and to introduce the Supply Bill for the coming fiscal year, and to dispose of any other business that may require immediate attention.

1st Reading.

On Warden Smith's motion the Bill to require Street Railways to have stopping places called Stations at all streets crossing their lines was passed to its Third Reading. After full discussion, on Warden Smith's motion it passed as a whole its title was changed to that of an Ordinance, and ordered properly engrossed, signed, and sealed.

2nd Reading.

On Warden Pinckney's motion the Bill to require Motor-men and Conductors to stop at Street corners received its Third Reading. After consideration on Warden Smith's motion it was adopted as a whole, its title changed to that of an Ordinance, and ordered properly engrossed, signed and sealed.

3rd Reading.

The Supply Bill received its First Reading, and on Warden Pinckney's motion it passed to Second Reading.

4th Reading.

The License Bill received its First Reading, and on Warden Smith's motion it received Second Reading.
