Special.

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., April 20, 1901.
A Special Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8 o'clock.

Present: A. D. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Jorgensen, Smith and Pincken.

The Intendant stated that this meeting was called on the recommendation of the Board of Health for the purpose of considering the smallpox situation; to determine whether compulsory vaccination be advisable; and that, if so, Dr. Horbeck, Health Officer of Charleston had offered to furnish all the points necessary at (5) five cents each.

After full discussion of the question, on Warden Jorgensen's motion, the Intendant was authorized, in connection with a Committee of One, to make the very best possible arrangement to vaccinate the people of the Town.

The Intendant appointed Warden Pincken the Committee of One.

Notice.

Warden Smith gave notice that at the next meeting of Council he would introduce a Bill for the compulsory vaccination of residents of Mt. Pleasant.
