

Regular.

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., July 15, 1901.  
A Regular Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8:30.

Present: — P. O. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Hauke, Jorgensen, Mitchell, and Smith.

The Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and confirmed.

The Intendant's Court reported that since the last report was made to Council, \$259.<sup>60</sup> had been collected in fines. The Marshal reported the receipt from various sources of \$4.30, of which he expended for various purposes \$2.<sup>40</sup>, leaving a balance of \$1.90 which he turned into the Treasury.

A Petition was received from M. L. Lockwood asking for a reduction of his licenses, which was, on motion of Warden Smith, laid on the table.

On motion of Warden Smith the two doctors were exempted from the payment of licenses in consideration of their services to the town, and the Clerk was ordered to write letters to them expressing the Council's thanks and appreciation.

A Bill of O. Parkman for \$3.<sup>10</sup> was ordered paid.

Water Works.

The Intendant stated that at a mass meeting of taxpayers a Committee on Water Works was appointed with O. H. Parkman as Chairman, and that the Committee asked that an appropriation be made for spearing the spring on the Commons, and for making several analyses of the water. On motion of Warden Jorgensen \$50.<sup>00</sup> or so much as is necessary was set apart for the purpose. The Intendant with Warden Smith were appointed a Committee to sink the spring.
