Council Chamber, Monday evening, 1 July, 1935.

A regular meeting of Council was held this evening with the Mayor, W.L. Erckmann and Aldermen Cranwell, Tiencken, Weston, Venning and G.M. Darby, Jr. and Robert F. Boyd, Clerk and Treasurer Pro Tem present.

Mr. G.F. von Kolnitz read the minutes of the special Council Meeting of June 24. The minutes were confirmed. The Minutes of Council Meeting of June 3 were read and confirmed after making a slight <sup>change</sup> in the wording of the Ordinance relative to regulating the sale of intoxicating liquors in Mt. Pleasant.

A communication from the Public Service Commission of Columbia, S.C. was read in which it was stated that the Light Bill, as rendered, was correct.

Alderman Tiencken moved that Robert F. Boyd be authorized to sign checks as Treasurer Pro Tem, and that he sign a signature card to be lodged in the Carolina Savings Bank, Charleston, S.C. The motion was seconded by Alderman Weston and was unanimously carried.

During a discussion concerning the purchase of hose for the Fire Department, Mr. von Kolnitz suggested that he be allowed to see to the purchase of said hose, as he was of the opinion that he could buy more cheaply than anyone else.

#### Committee Reports:

Alderman Weston reported concerning the maps from Mr. Edward Royall. The report stated that since the maps were not at all helpful or satisfactory, the opinion of the committee was that the maps should be declined. Alderman Tiencken moved that the report of the Committee be sustained. The motion was seconded and unanimously ratified.

Alderman Tiencken, Committee on Books, reported that the Books of the Town had been examined as far as possible, and were found in good condition.

Alderman Weston suggested that the Mayor appoint Mr. La Bruce, Mr. Stacker to investigate complaints concerning the fact that Mt. Pleasant negroes working on P.W.A. are being fired and non-resident negroes hired instead.

Alderman Weston moved that the Mayor's salary be restored to \$25.00 per month. The motion was seconded by Alderman Tiencken and was unanimously adopted.

Alderman Weston moved that Councilmen be paid the sum of \$1.00 for each <sup>meeting</sup> of Council attended. The motion was seconded by Alderman Tiencken and ~~#####~~ carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
